
Eagle Eye

Basic Configuration (One Computer)

The configurations described below are most commonly used for small track meets or J.V. competitions where the Eagle Eye computer **IS NOT NETWORKED** with a second computer that manages the results.

Option 1


In this scenario race times are generated within Eagle Eye and then written down on paper or re-typed into another results computer.

Eagle Eye only	One computer

Option 2

In this scenario both Eagle Eye and Hy-Tek software are operating on the same computer.

It is possible to use one computer for both timing and results however it is important to realize that you run the risk of slowing down the meet as your timing duties overlap with data entry for the field events. This shared responsibility can be a challenge; however you may be able to alleviate much of the time crunch if field events are typed into the results software during distance races.

Tip: Remember, you can work within Eagle Eye software or go back and forth between Eagle Eye and Hy-Tek while a race is being run --- allowing you to read a previous race or perform data entry while a distance race is being contested....just as long you have triggered the Pyro-Flash for the current race - you are 'good to go.' Once you begin recording however you must stay on task and not jump around within the software.
